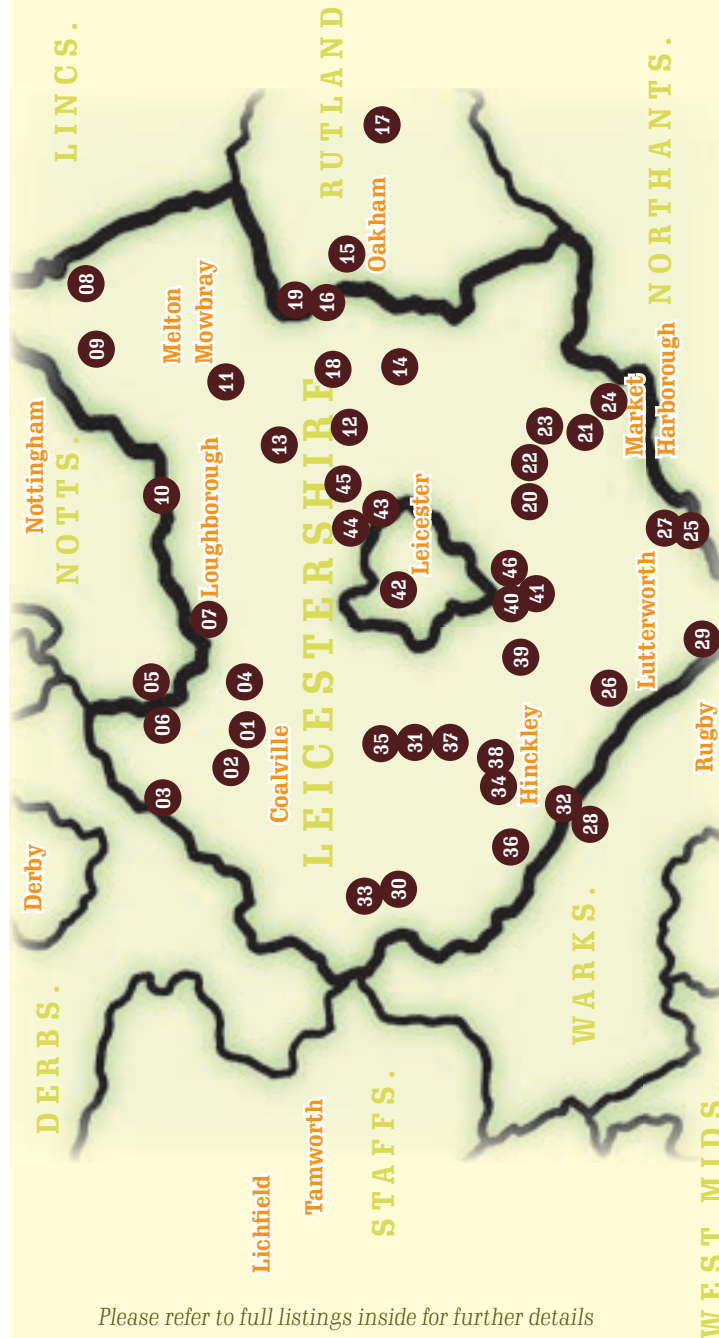

This guide features farmers, growers, processors and retailers across Leicestershire who are selling local food to Leicestershire people.

Local food is defined as **"The nearest route from field to plate"** and the Farmers' Markets often define this as a 30 mile radius from the point of sale.

The local food businesses are set out in relation to which towns they are closest to. There is also a section for those in and around the city of Leicester and an index on page 25 for quick reference.

If you buy your goods from the businesses listed in this guide, you will be benefiting Leicestershire in many ways... so please, read on...



DESCRIPTION of the icons

Several vegetable box schemes operate in Leicestershire. Many farm shops run their own schemes – other schemes are run by groups of producers.

If a farm doesn't have a shop, but wants to sell directly from the farm, they set up a stall and sell literally from the gate, using signs to indicate when seasonal goods are being sold.

This indicates that a product can be bought all year round (i.e. beef or honey). The farm may not have a counter or shop, but may expect you to come to the farm door.

Where this symbol is present in the listing, you will know that goods are available in all seasons. This is often the case for beef, cereals, milk and many processed goods.

Remember that some producers are seasonal, and where it indicates in the guide that they sell at farmers' markets, this may only be in certain seasons.

A farm shop is a purpose built premises which often includes many different types of produce. Ask which produce is locally produced if you want to support Leicestershire farmers.

Some farms open seasonally, so always call before making a special journey. The map in this Guide shows their approximate location only, so it is wise to also call them for specific directions.

Many farms, producers and retailers offer a delivery service. Orders can be placed via fax, e-mail or telephone. Delivery may be included, or charged extra, so always check.

Don't have the time to travel out to farms? This icon indicates they sell to local shops.

There's a period in the year that game have a chance to breed. They mainly live in woodland – gamekeepers & farmers only hunt them in season.

If you are planning a day trip, look out for the café on site sign. There are some truly wonderful farm shop cafés serving delicious home made goods that have to be visited to be believed.

Some breweries, vineyards and farms have visitors and carry out tours/demonstrations. Remember farms are working businesses – it's dangerous to walk around unescorted. Always call first.

Some fruit farms are 'Pick Your Own', but not all, and some farms will employ people to pick to orders for retailers. Don't expect all fruit farms to be Pick Your Own.

Support local producers by buying their food & drink when out for a meal. Some producers list the places they supply. A call to them on the number given will let you find out more.

Farm grows some/all of the goods it sells. Farm shops may sell goods from other areas, so ask to check if you'd prefer to buy local.
