The Taste of Hinckley & Bosworth Summer Trail

Out and about and there is no better place to be than in the English countryside. Find a green space, perhaps by one of the many waterways stretching across the Borough. Visit farms selling fresh local meat or sumptuous strawberries and raspberries to enjoy at an evening barbeque. Cycle the winding lanes, and see honeysuckle and dog rose in bloom, or be daring and learn how to cool down in the water whilst windsurfing or canoeing. This trail encompasses much of the National Forest, 'a forest in the making', which covers over 200 square miles across Leicestershire, Derbyshire and Staffordshire.

This trail includes Congerstone, Market Bosworth, Osbaston and Ratby and covers approximately sixteen miles. You may wish to cycle or walk between parts of this trail. To help you plan your route, you can view the distance between locations. You may wish to follow the suggested route or visit places at your leisure.

National Organic Gardening Weekends

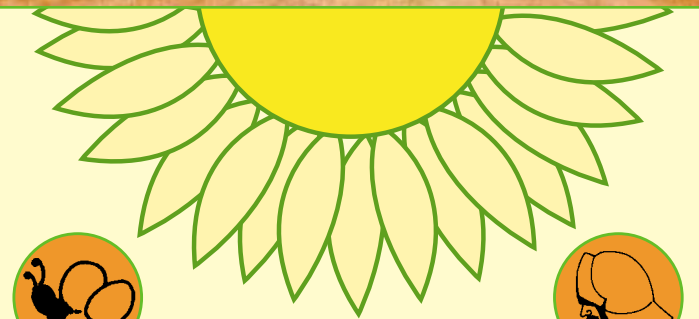
Sence Valley Murray Grey Beef

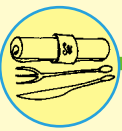

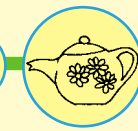
Bosworth Water Trust
