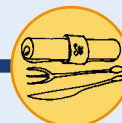

## Hinckley Farmers Market

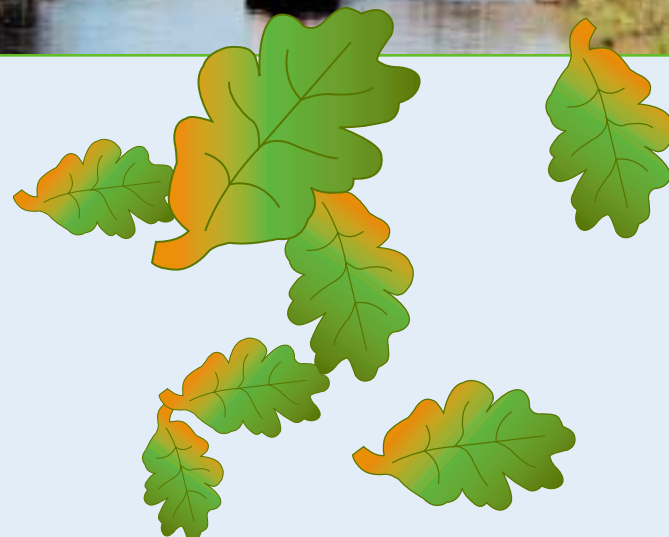
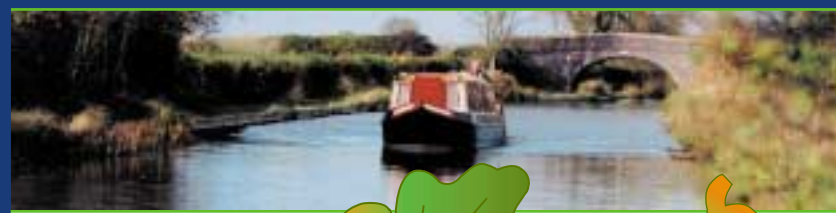
